Number of high-growth enterprises down slightly in 2022

Majority of high-growth enterprises located in the service sector

Vienna, 2023-12-14 – In 2022, according to preliminary data from Statistics Austria, there were 3 265 enterprises in Austria with ten or more employees and an average annual increase in the number of employees of at least 10% within three years. Thus, the number of high growth enterprises has slightly decreased compared to 2021 (–1.7%, 2021: 3 322). Around 7% of these are so-called "gazelles", young high-growth enterprises.

"The number of high-growth enterprises developed less dynamically in 2022. Compared to the previous year, it fell by 1.7% to 3 265. In 2022, as in the previous year, most enterprises with an average annual increase in the number of employees of at least 10% within three years were in in wholesale and retail trade and construction — even though there was a sharper decline in high-growth enterprises in construction," says Statistics Austria Director General Tobias Thomas.

Highest number of high-growth enterprises in wholesale and retail trade and construction

More than 70% (2 339) of the high-growth enterprises were located in 2022 in the services sector. By economic sector, the most high-growth enterprises were recorded in wholesale and retail trade (617), construction (520), manufacturing (383) and professional, scientific and technical activities (377, see Table 1).

In 2022, the largest percentage increases of high-growth enterprises compared with 2021 were in the areas accommodation and food service activities (+56.0%), education (+46.4%) and other service activities (+11.8%), while significant decreases occurred in the areas water electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (-66.7%), financial and insurance (-38.7%) as well as in arts, entertainment and recreation (-16.7%). In these sectors, however, the number of high-growth enterprises is also rather low in absolute values (see table 1).

Many "gazelles" in construction as well as accommodation and food service activities

Around 7% of high-growth enterprises in 2022 are so-called gazelles, high-growth enterprises that have been on the market for five years or less. The largest shares of these gazelles were found in the areas of arts, entertainment and recreation (16.7%), accommodation and food service activities (13.3%) as well as administrative and support service activities (12.2%, see table 2). In absolute values, the most gazelles were in the areas of construction (54), accommodation and food service activities (43) and administrative and support service activities (30).

Vienna, Lower Austria, Styria and Upper Austria with most young high-growth enterprises

There were particularly large numbers of young high-growth enterprises in 2022 in Vienna (80), Lower Austria (36) as well as in Styria and Upper Austria (34 each; see Table 3). In Vienna alone, around one third (33.8%) of all gazelles-enterprises was located. The highest shares of gazelles in all high growth enterprises were identified in Vienna (9.3%), Carinthia (8.1%) and Styria (7.4%). In contrast, the rates of gazelles were lowest in Salzburg (4.0%), Burgenland (5.5%) as well as in Tyrol and Vorarlberg (5.8% each).

Information on methodology, definitions: The statistics on high growth enterprises are compiled on the basis of register and administrative data. High growth enterprises are those employer enterprises that show an average annual growth of at least 10% in the number of employees over a three-year-period (e.g. 2018 to 2021). All employer enterprises with fewer than ten employees at the beginning of the observation period are eliminated from the data. Similarly, enterprises that were enterprise births in the starting year (t-3) are not taken into account in the reporting year (t). The growth of an enterprise does not have to be continuous over the entire period, but is measured over the entire period. "False" growth is excluded and occurs when the increase in the number of employees of a company was primarily due to acquisitions of enterprises or mergers. Cases of "false" growth must therefore be removed from the population of high growth enterprises. As of the 2021 reporting year, young high growth enterprises (so-called gazelles) are also compiled and published. These are a sub-population of high growth enterprises with the additional restriction of a maximum age of five years.
